

The Ohio Facilities Construction Commission offers funding to reimburse schools for the sampling and replacement of eligible drinking fountains, water coolers, plumbing fixtures, and limited connected piping. School buildings that were constructed prior to 1990 are the target facilities for this grant program. The program reserves \$15,000 per school for the assessment of eligible fixtures and the material costs to replace those fixtures if they are found to be the cause of lead over the federal action level (15 parts per billion) in drinking water.
